ITEM 6 BUSINESS (DISCUSSION AGENDA ITEM):

- A. Rescheduling of Elementary Mill Levy Election - Due to the Covid-19 pandemic on April 2nd Yellowstone County Superintendent Sherry Long, in coordination with Elections Administrator Bret Rutherford, made the decision to cancel the May 5th school election under MCA 202-20-108 which reads in part: "If the governor declares a state of emergency or disaster under Title 10, chapter 3, a school election may be canceled by the county superintendent of schools or, in the absence of the county superintendent, by the state superintendent of public instruction. As soon as convenient after the declaration of a state of emergency or disaster is terminated, the trustees of the district shall set a new date for the election..." At the time the election was earmarked for a tentative rescheduled date of July 7th. While the Governor's state of emergency declaration remains in place, the district's legal counsel has consulted both the Yellowstone County District Attorney's office and the Governor's Chief Legal Counsel to determine whether the continued declaration prevents trustees from setting a new date for the election. The Governor's Chief Legal Counsel provided authorization to represent that the official position of the Governor's Office is that nothing in MCA 20-20-108 would prevent the County or the School District from going forward with the election. The Yellowstone County Attorney's office has confirmed they have no problem with the district running the election if the Board chooses to do so.
